


December Meefing **Zigkligkís**



Theo Rushin (TEO) performed an energy filled artistic routine to music where a boy awoke on Christmas morning to find presents that turned into wondrous magic gifts. He opened a box with a magic hat from which he pulled a long pole. The kids were riveted as he produced gifts that changed colors; a fan that generated a snowfall of confetti; a box with floating soap bubbles that magically turned into lots of crystal balls; and a mystery cup that streamed magic coils into the audience. This was a superlative and unique act created by TEO.


Kevin McGuire (The Amazing Kevin) did a Coloring book routine in which the kids were completely baffled. Then the comedy flowed with nesting candy cane wands and a cut a restored rope routine. The Amazing Kevin then did a tissue paper tear resulting in a paper hat that the little boy immediately tore from his head. This was followed by a "Where's Randolph" bit and led into a hilarious Santa's hat routine. Kevin's unique brand of children's humor had the kids jumping and laughing over his entire act.

Drew Owen (Professor Fizzwiffle) performed in full attire as the wizard wizard's Professor. He used various magic wands such as the banana wand, a giant wand that came unsprung like Popsy Topsy wand, misbehaving wand, rising wand (similar to silver scepter) and the vanishing wand while it was held by a spectator. He had the kids wild with excitement with a squeeking sponge ball routine that used a magic gong—a clever and perfectly executed routine. Next he presented Alphonso, the psychic rubber chicken, a "mind reading" effect that found the chosen card. He ended with a child pulling a long string of

silks from Alphonso's mouth and nothing says "Happy Holidays" like a rubber chicken. The children thoroughly enjoyed Drew's act.

Meyer Louis (Louis Magician) opened with a silk to wand effect and followed with a miss-made smiley face and he finally got it right. Next, he presented a picture of a hat in which a rabbit appeared and changed to flowers then other items, finally appearing again. The kids were thrilled when Marty the Mongoose got loose from his cage and need to be brought under control—a very creative version of Rocky Raccoon. Louis' Christmas tree was bare no lights or decorations. After some byplay and help from the children the tree was found brightly decorated. Louis then brought out his English sheepdog "Woofer". Woofer performed his first trick by blowing up a balloon. He did this by blowing in Louis' ear and to everyone's delight he made the balloon disappear. Next was a hilarious routine where Woofer kept producing a red ball from his mouth. Woofer was a tour de force for this evening's show.

Maryland Magician Tapped for National Christmas Tree Lighting



LAUREL, MD – For the second straight year, Laurel Maryland magician Eric Henning was selected to perform at the National Christmas Tree Lighting on December 6. Along with nine other acts, Henning, the only magician in the group, entertain the crowd of more than 6,000 families as they entered Presidential Park before the televised show.

Presidential events are becoming a habit for the Maryland magician. In 2001 and 2005, he performed at the Presidential Pre-Inaugural Candlelight Dinners for President George W. Bush. He performed at the White House Easter Egg Roll in 2002 and 2003 and at last year's National Christmas Tree Lighting. But by far, says Henning, his greatest honor was performing for President and Mrs. Obama and their family at the White House Halloween party in 2010. "The White House became a magical space with things floating in full light," says Henning, calling it "definitely the highlight" of his 40-year magical career.

Discovery Channel Magician Wayne Houchin Burned During Dominican Republic Television Appearance







Wayne Houchin was burned during an appearance in support of the Curiosidades show in the Dominican Republic. He released the above picture and the following statement on his Twitter and Facebook: Monday while appearing on a TV show in the Dominican Republic, the TV host took a handful of Aqua De Florida, ignited it and intentionally dropped it on my head, setting me on fire.

I was not aware he was going to do this. This was not a stunt or part of an act – this was a criminal attack. The fast actions of the rest of our Curiosidades team saved my life. The fire was put out and I was rushed to the emergency room. I have bad burns on my head, face, neck and right hand. I am in pain, but am recovering. I will update you on the situation when I can.

Houchin was most recently seen on Discovery Channel's Breaking Magic. Aqua de Florida or Florida Water is a flammable cologne popular in Latin Countries.

Monday 26th of November at 12:35 noon when Bolívar Bueno, Wayne and Fran Houchin ended recording their segment on the TV program "Acércate a los Astros de la señora Adriana Azzi" which was being hosted by Mr. Franklin Barazarte (Wayne's attacker), who also serves as the director of the TV show, who without notice and without any security measures, offered to "give them" a blessing using "Agua de Florida" (which is highly flammable due to its high alcohol content) proceeded to set fire to Wayne Houchin, resulting in serious burns to his face, neck, right ear, and his right hand.

We stress that this event was not part of our presentation, nor did we receive any notice that the host was going to carry out this PREMEDITATED CRIMINAL ACT.

Unfortunately the TV studio facilities did not have fire extinguishers, or first aid kits, anywhere on premises. Repeated requests for help to the staff of the studios were ignored. Only the rapid and efficient response by our team saved Wayne's life.

Right now he is stable, but sadly some so-called "journalists", lacking professionalism and sensitivity to human suffering, have taken a very unfortunate event and have used their airtime to ridicule Wayne for suffering this tragedy.

Misters Aridio Castillo and Domingo Bautista of the Dominican TV magazine "Super Revista", publicly have accused our team of practicing VooDoo and witchcraft and that the attack was divine justice for the evils of our cast members' practices. We ask you, our friends and family, for your prayers and positive thoughts for the speedy recovery of our friend and colleague Wayne Houchin.

Ring 50 wishes Wayne a speedy recovery. It is with sad news that I sent you this message about Wayne Houchin. As you know Wayne came to Ring 50 in August 2011 and gave us a wonderful lecture. While it appears he's not in danger of losing his life, we can only imagine what he will have to deal with. There were hundreds of notes on his Facebook page from magicians all over and I wrote a note on behalf of Ring 50. You can also find more on The Magic Cafe. I asked those in the know if there's anything we can do for him beyond sending our wishes for a very speedy recovery -- and I'll let you know.
