A grave-side Broken Wand ceremony was part of funeral observances held for Stan and members of his family on November 25th, attended by Ring 50 members: Danny Selnick, Larry Lipman, Bob Patterson, John Roberts, Arnie Fuoco, Sam Brothers and Augie Arnstein. Territorial Vice President Dwight Redman conducted the Broken Wand ceremony. Stan became a member of Ring 50 in 1962 and was President in 1968-69. Chuck had a card selected and after much humorous by-play the card's identity, the four of diamonds, was revealed in the banana. Encourage friends, coworkers, etc., to attend. They can register in advance at



#### Force Nine

Here is an interesting way to force the number "nine". You need the following double-faced number cards 1/5, 6/2, 4/8, 7/3. Arrange in 1,6,4,8 order faces showing. Display to audience, flip them over in order to show 5,2,8,3. Ask a spectator whether he would like to use the front or rear numbers. (free choice #1) Whichever he chooses, deal them alternately into two piles, ask him to choose a pile (free choice #2) and put the other one aside. Show two remaining numbers, ask him to choose one card to flip over to number on back (free choice #3). The two cards will always add up to the number nine. Be sure to stress all the free choices. Ex: Deal face cards into two piles 1,4 and 6,7. Eliminate the 6,7 pile leaving the 1 & 4 cards. Flip over the 4 and show the eight which, with the 1, adds up to nine. If the 1 is flipped you get a 5+4=9. The same goes for the 6/7 pile. The rest is up to you. Use your magical wiles to get a chosen card 9<sup>th</sup> from the top of a deck and count down to it, etc. etc. The number cards don't have to be playing cards make your own with number stickers or a Sharpie on heavy white stock. Put it in your tool box.
