## AUCUST MEETING HICHLIGHTS

The August meeting featured a teach-in with four Ring 50 members: Allen Cleveland, Christophe Jelinski, Chuck Jones and Noland Montgomery. Vice President Danny Selnick convened the meeting and announced that renowned close-up magician Scott Alexander would lecture at the Sept. 4 meeting. The November meeting will showcase performances by new members of the Ring; the last such new-member night was held two years ago. The theme for the October meeting will be announced later. Chuck Jones noted that in addition to the lecture at the Ring, Scott Alexander would conduct a five-hour workshop on Saturday, Sept. 7 beginning at 4 p.m. The workshop will be held at the home of Ring 50 Treasurer Mike Peckham in Gainesville, Va. Details and online registration information are on the Ring 50 website, www.IBMRing50.org. The Ring 50 lecture is free to paid-up members, $\$ 20$ for all others. The workshop is $\$ 150$. Danny Selnick announced that planning for Magi-Whirl 2020 is already underway, but it will be held March 13 and 14, again at the Rachel M. Schlesinger Concert Hall in Alexandria.

When guests were introduced, Jens Henriksen, a visiting
member from Ring 92 in Vancouver, surprised Danny by doing a quick ring on rope routine. Another guest and potential new member, Homer L. Twigg IV, was introduced by Hugh Turley. Sgt.-at-Arms Sam Bothers conducted the monthly 50-50 raffle drawing and Mike Whelan won the \$31 pot; an equal amount went to the Ring treasury. Laurie Curry noted that many magic items, including props and magazines from the collection of ailing member Jim Flanigan had been sold or given away before the meeting began. She said Jim would welcome cards or visits.

Secretary Larry Lipman, filling in for Louis Meyer (attending Kapital Kidvention West), introduced two members of the Counts of Conjuring youth group to perform tricks. Matthew Nichols performed a classic version of Professor's Nightmare, which had been the subject of instruction at the Counts meeting. The Counts meet at 6 p.m. before each Ring 50 meeting. Isabell Tasheva-Shetler performed a blooming flower effect with a prop she received at the Counts meeting.

## TEACH-IN

Following the business portion of the meeting, the audience divided into groups in the four corners of the room for the teach-in. Each of

## Quickie - Imaginality

(Basic idea thanks to Alec Negri)
Effect: Can something you imagine become a reality? Let's see. (To a spectator) I want you to imagine, hanging in space before you like a hologram, a beautiful sapphire. Next to it, a sparkling diamond and next to that a gorgeous ruby. Do you see them in your imagination? Good - so do I. Now choose one of the three precious jewels. Which one did you choose? The ruby? Okay I'll put our imaginary diamond and sapphire in my pocket and the ruby in my hand. If I squeeze hard, I can turn this ruby into reality. (Open hand to show actual ruby) Working: You begin with a jewel finger-palmed in each hand - in this case an acrylic sapphire and a ruby. As you gesture to indicate where the spectator should imagine the jewels to be, take care they are well hidden behind your middle, ring and pinkie fingers (Ramsey subtlety). If he chooses, say, the ruby, fake plucking the other two jewels out of the air and putting them in your pocket, ditching the sapphire. Then reach out and take the imaginary ruby in your hand. Remind him that he had three choices. You reveal the actual ruby in your hand proving the impossible can happen. You do the same thing if the sapphire is chosen. If the imaginary diamond is chosen, have him put it in his pocket. You mime taking the ruby and sapphire in your hands. Say "Okay, you chose the imaginary diamond. I'll just take the ones you didn't want and make them a reality. "You see? It can be done!" Open both hands.
(Note) Of course this routine can be done with any different objects; miniature animals from Michaels, sponge balls, etc., anything that can be palmed.

the four teachers demonstrated one or more effects and then provided detailed instructions. After 20 minutes, each teacher moved to another corner until every teacher had visited every corner.


Noland Montgomery

Noland Montgomery taught a multi-phase routine of his own making - with moves adapted from numerous sources - that involved a half-dollar coin seemingly vanishing into the cap of a Sharpie pen and then magically appearing out of the pen. Noland said he didn't know how a half-dollar could fit into a Sharpie, but apparently it did. The coin and pen repeatedly appeared and disappeared throughout the routine.


Chuck Jones

Chuck Jones used the three ropes from Professor's Nightmare to teach a routine developed by Richard Sanders in his Fiber Optics DVD. Chuck made the ropes seemingly meld into one very long rope and
then demonstrated how he could remove the ends and have an endless loop before replacing the ends in the rope.

Jelinski
demonstrated how he could make a person raise one arm or the other while standing several feet away and without appearing to touch them. Then Christophe revealed the secret to this feat of mentalism and gave pointers as several of the members tried using the techniques to cause the same effect upon other members.


Allen Cleveland
Allen Cleveland presented a rapid-fire demonstration of closeup magic using a thumb tip, sponges, rubber bands and a dollar-size coin. First Allen demonstrated how to conceal a thumb tip after performing the classic disappearing silk trick. Then he demonstrated two versions of Crazy Man's Handcuffs, using his
hands and the hand of a spectator. He also performed a single jumping band effect that transferred the rubber band from his hand to a spectator's hand. After a devilishly clever one-coin routine, Allen showed a four-sponge routine that ended with a sponge shaped like the number 4.

After the meeting, several members stayed to go over pointers with the four instructors.
